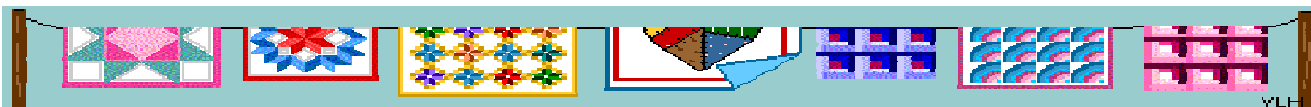
Due at the October Meeting
