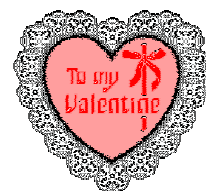

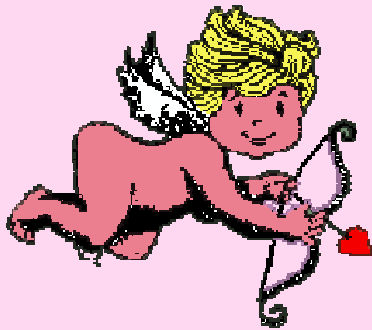




## January's Meeting
