Peanut Butter Fudge

2 c. sugar	1 1/3 c. peanut butter
1/2 c. milk	1 jar (7 oz.) marsh mallow crème

In a saucepan, bring sugar and milk to a boil, boil for 3 minutes. Add peanut butter and marshmallow crème; mix well.

Quickly pour into a buttered 9 inch square pan. Chill until set. Cut into squares.

Yield: 3 - 4 dozen
