Materials for the Fat Quarter Placemat Workshop

The first listing is for 3 placemats; the second for 6 placemats.

Fabric:

3 coordinated, contrasting fat quarters (6)

1 yd. backing (1 1/2 yd.)

1/2 yd. binding (3/4 yd.)

1 yd. batting (1 1/2 yd.)

Batting should be light to medium weight, either fusible or non-fusible.

Sewing supplies: sewing machine, thread, rotary cutter and mat (18 x 24 works the best), ruler (3 x 18 or 24 recommended).

Some irons and ironing boards will be needed; also extension cords (please mark).

The workshop will begin at 9 a.m. and finish in the early afternoon. Please bring a lunch, and snacks to share if you wish.

Coffee will be made.

* If you want to show a quilt at the Slippery Rock Arts Festival on April 28th, bring it in to Jean at the April guild meeting. Be sure to put a paper label on it with pertinent information including your name, phone number, name of quilt, pattern, when made, etc.
