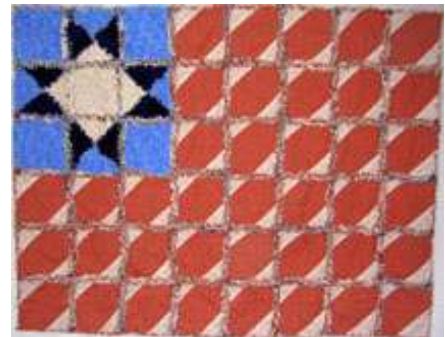
**In August we will have a challenge: a Fall Wallhanging. So dig one out or make a new fall wallhanging for our August picnic.**

### Works of Nancy Crow

There is a wonderful exhibit at CMU of Nancy Crow's quilts. Nancy Crow (google her) is one of the or the most important people in developing art quilts. The show is three floors of her quilts made over the last 20 years, and represent her use of three types of techniques - strip piecing with her development of free cutting (not using rulers), monoprinting with dyes, and stenciling and painting marks on the fabric. The show is on until Aug 15 - Tuesdays through Sundays, 11:30 until 5. It's free.
